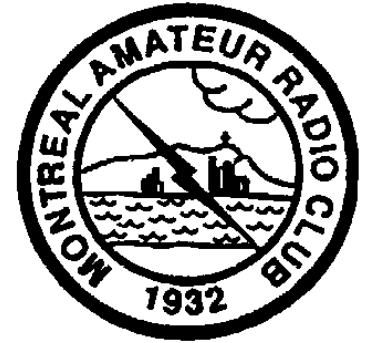

 LAST CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

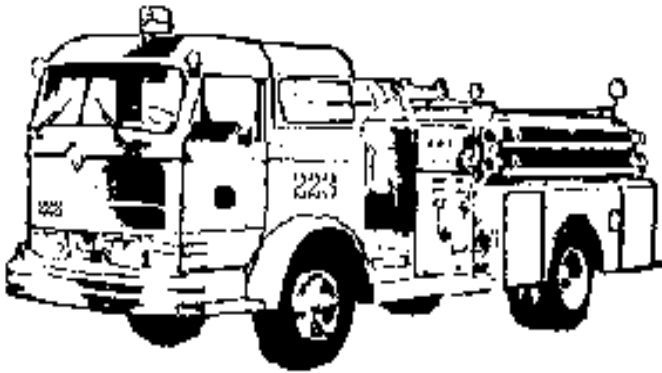

SCANNERS HEAR IT FIRST

So I'll see you in September... So says the song lyrics, gee there you are, and here I am and its September so the song must be right. Hope you had a safe and earfullish summer. Not a lot of changes in the metro area for radio. Montreal Fire Department is progressively getting worse.

One good frequency that works in that system is 867.5125 MHz, fireground simplex, which carries for about a kilometre but if you're close enough to be there you won't have to worry about trunking systems walking over regular UHF systems.
